**JOHN MEARSHEIMER** is Distinguished Service Professor of Political Science and Co-Director of the Program on International Security Policy at the University of Chicago, where he has taught since 1982. He graduated from West Point in 1970 and then served five years as an officer in the U.S. Air Force. His books include *Conventional Deterrence* and *The Tragedy of Great Power Politics*. He has written op-ed pieces on Bosnia, nuclear proliferation, American policy towards India, the failure of Arab-Israeli peace efforts, and the folly of invading Iraq. Ritter spent several months of the Persian Gulf War serving under General Norman Schwarzkopf with U.S. Central Command headquarters in Saudi Arabia, where he played an instrumental role in combat operations targeting Iraqi mobile missile launchers threatening Israel.
